## Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA)

In 2003, the U.S. Congress passed federal privacy standards intended to protect the privacy of patients' medical records and other health information supplied to health care providers and insurance companies. Known as the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), these newly developed standards provide patients with greater control over the ways in which their health information is disclosed and/or shared to health care providers or insurance companies.
